The Institution of Engineers Mauritius (IEM) is honoured to announce to all its members and all stakeholders concerned with the Education, Training, Professional Development, and the Employment of engineers in Mauritius, that the [Royal Academy of Engineering UK](#), has approved to support an initiative of the **Institution of Engineers Mauritius** aimed at ***Building Engineering capacity through the Accreditation of Engineering Education*** in Mauritius, under the GCRF Africa Catalyst 16/17 Scheme, where in our Institution was in competition with sister organisations from 49 Sub-Saharan countries. We thank the Working Group on Engineering Accreditation for their efforts in this outcome.

The Institution will receive support to the tune of £40,000 to enable the IEM to implement its project which has been estimated to cost £48365.
